

PLANNING YOUR DECK REMODEL: A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

STEP 1: DEFINE THE GOALS & STRATEGIES

you must also consider the very real issues of product shortages, longer than expected shipping and delivery times, and increased product costs.

STEP 2: MAKE A LIST

Think through your wants and needs and then make a list of everything you can think of that you want in your new outdoor space. You can ask these questions while making your list:



□ WHAT DO YOU PLAN TO DO WITH THE AREA?

Maybe you want to remodel your deck to be an extra entertainment area or an outdoor dining space. Whatever it is, you should know what you would like to do with the space.

□ WILL THERE BE MORE SEATING OR STORAGE SPACES?

Every deck needs some sort of seating and storage space. Ask yourself if built-in seating is going to be needed. Do you need furniture to provide storage? If you want both, you can opt for benches with built-in storage underneath.

DO YOU WANT ADDITIONAL FEATURES?

If you enjoy grilling in your backyard, an outdoor kitchen could be just what you are looking for. A fire pit will allow you to enjoy your deck even in colder weather. Be sure to put the features you want on your new deck on your list.

STEP 3: RESEARCH LOCAL CODES

Most home improvement projects, including your deck remodeling project, will have specific requirements. These requirements ensure the work being done on your home is following state and local code. Residential decks typically require you to obtain a building permit.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW.

- Every municipality has its own set of rules for obtaining a permit. You may be asked to submit a blueprint to your local building codes department for approval, and then go through an inspection process.
- Permits ensure the health and safety of future occupants and the quality of the project.

PRO TIP

It is easier to get a building permit for a low, freestanding deck.



STEP 4: PLAN YOUR SPACE

The design and placement of your deck are significant factors that affect your home. The result may provide either a beautiful addition or an unsightly feature to your property. Knowing this, it is important to assess the location of your new deck.

PREP YOUR YARD.

Consider how you will prepare the location. Is the area where you intend to construct the deck relatively level? If the answer is no, some work will need to be done. Clear as much of the deck site as you can. The cleaner the future deck area is, the less maintenance you will have to do after it is built.

ACCESSIBILITY AND USABILITY.

Many homeowners prefer to build a deck off of their kitchen or living room for ease of access. An accessible deck is one that is usable for anyone, regardless of mobility.

Other than an entrance from the house, what entry and exit points would be convenient? Stairs to the backyard? Would a second staircase make the deck more accessible to the garage? Consider use and plan accordingly.

STEP 5: CREATE A BUDGET

Knowing how much money you have to spend on renovations will help you make better decisions about finishes, appliances, and other features.
